MAPUA WATERFRONT & WHARF.

1. Proposal for relocated Boat Ramp. Martyn was asked if there was any significant feedback received since his presentation (hard copy also tabled again at this meeting). The following motion was then put to the meeting:

THAT the MDCA supports in principle, the prepared and circulated plans for the future location of the boat ramp in the Mapua Waterfront Park area. Feedback from members can be sent to mdcaec@gmail.com and stored by the Association for inclusion in the TDC's future review of development of its lands in the Mapua Waterfront Area. **Moved** Colin Wilson/Jan Ralfe with both Colin and Jan invited to speak to the motion.

Further comments were invited. Martin Lindley spoke against the motion with concerns primarily around parking and the compromising of the recreational area. Martyn Barlow clarified the motion and the process following several questions and comments from the floor, noting that community support in principle, is all that is sought at the present point in time, particularly in line with timeframes around TDC land review. Elena as chair offered further clarification around the motion.

There was a brief discussion about the planned TDC land review, following comments by David Mitchell, with Tim King speaking to this issue.

The motion was then voted on with 43 in favour and three abstaining and was **CARRIED.** Waterfront Advisory meeting due to be held this week and the views of the meeting will be raised at that meeting.

John Palmer raised a concern about lighting and security cameras at the wharf area. Gillian Pollock and Tim King spoke.

- 2. Maintaining Wharf Reserve motion as circulated was TABLED. (David Mitchell). David invited to speak about the issue of the temporary toilet arrangements for the Golden Bear. Several other members spoke. Agreed that this issue to also be raised at the Waterfront Advisory meeting. The meeting was asked if there are any other related issues to be raised at this meeting.
- **3.Aquarium memorial/ Interpretative panel.** Some feedback received from Facebook postings. Meeting reminded that money raised following the Aquarium fire is being held by the Mapua Community Trust. ACTION. Assn to write to the Trust to say that consideration is still being given to this issue. Tim offered to seek potential designs for an appropriate memorial, via Facebook.
