MDCA minutes, February 2018: Clare Kininmonth asked to amend the minutes on behalf of Martyn Barlow from the Mapua Boat Club noting that the minutes misinterpreted his comments and did not reflect what he was saying. The Boat Club's position is that they need access to the existing boat ramp maintained until a solution is found. As the TDC is supporting a regional boat ramp in the LTP, that is what Mapua may end up with. Noted that the Boat club are not opposing a regional boat ramp but it is not the main aim of the Boat Club. The meeting agreed to amend the minutes to reflect the Boat Club's position. MOVED (Rob Smith/Devin Gallagher) THAT the MDCA apply to RATA Foundation for funds to cover the provision of a BBQ and shade sales for the Mapua Waterfront Park

There followed a robust discussion around whether the grant application should include shade.

Naomi clarified the criteria for Rata Foundation grants, noting that only one application can be submitted so the purpose for the grant should be carefully considered.

The motion was **CARRIED** by a majority.

Waterfront Park Advisory Group There was a discussion about TDC Correspondence regarding the TDC's review of the Terms of Reference for the Advisory Group and their intention of "disbanding it" in favour of a working group focussing on the implementation of the Mapua Waterfront Area Masterplan.

Tim King spoke, noting that the terms of reference of the WAG need to be updated and the intention is still to have a group compromising the community.

Elena spoke noting her aim with the motion (displayed for the meeting to consider), is a need to maintain a cooperative partnership model.

Devin Gallagher spoke noting his opposition to the word "disband" as noted in the MDCA meeting agenda.

Naomi asked about time frames and inclusivity.
