Good morning Cr McNamara

The NCC administer and our Council pays an agreed amount each year, which was based on a proportion of users.

Marg Parfitt (NCC) has provided the details below:

A description of the scheme is on our website....this explains the subsidy of \$10 or 50% of the fare(the less of the two) .

It does cover TDC areas where a provider exists. Currently there is no provider in Golden Bay or Murchison.

We have just (this week) moved across to the electronic card system (Ridewise) and our database of membership has been reviewed as part of that project.

We will have a much richer data set going forward as the Ridewise platform will be able to produce reports about usage and where travel took place.

We know that overall the scheme subsidised for 40,000 trips in the last year, using \$241,000 of subsidy. At this time I can not give you a breakdown of what percentage of that travel took place in TDC confines or was by TDC residents.

The figure of \$85K that TDC contribute to the overall scheme was based on an estimate of where TM members live from an old database – which estimated approximately one third of the members live within TDC boundaries.
