Mapua Reserve Playground Upgrade

A whole year has past since MDCA held a brainstorming session to discover the communities wish list for the playground upgrade. The unfortunate fires earlier in the year meant this project got shelved while TDC staff attended to the fire and its aftermath. Thankfully, this project is now back on track with the attached draft plan open for your comments.

To explain as briefly as possible, the idea within the plan is to move the Great Taste Cycle path along the the boundary fence of the Mapua Hall carpark to create a separation and minimise cycle traffic from the playground area while opening up the opportunity to increase the size of the playground itself.

The intention is to replace all the grassed area with a suitable playground surface (small grassed areas are expensive for TDC to maintain) and enable more area for playground equipment as well as tables and seats.

The pink area near the tennis courts will be wheel chair friendly, both in the type of surface and the equipment installed. This surfaced will include a design from a local Mapua Maori Artist.

We would appreciate your feedback on the design whether it is supportive or not so.

This request is not straight forward given the age of the equipment and the fact that the school must follow all rules and regulations relating to playgrounds also. I believe we have had an offer from some locals to take it away. The odd time we have been paid if it is going to private location and other times as long as people cover the cost of the removal we are very happy. But we don't allow schools or playgroups etc to take old equipment as it could put them in a position of non compliance

Happy to talk this through further and see what we can do. I certainly don't want it dumped and sometimes we keep equipment stored at Rabbit Island as replacement parts for other old playgrounds around the district.
