

## **Tasman Resource Management Plan( TRMP) - Community Consultation Process**

### **Context:**

TDC would like MDCA and residents of the Mapua Community to be involved in the *Tasman Resource Management Plan*( TRMP) consultation process set for Oct/Nov 2020

### **What does the TRMP review cover?**

A general review of the Mapua Strategic Plan, which broadly covers:

- potential future residential and commercial development (including within the key Mapua Waterfront Area)
- related water / sewage infrastructure needs
- *Indicative Roads*
- upgrades to existing roads, cycle ways and footpaths
- expansion of recreational parks / reserves and facilities.

### **Why is this important?**

It will be used as the planning basis for new roads within newly developed subdivisions (identified on maps as “Indicative Roads”) and, very importantly, where these Indicative Roads will connect with existing roads, impacting traffic volumes, parking availability, noise levels and pedestrian safety in these areas. Given Mapua’s unique position with only 1 transit road for all services through the village (Aranui Drive), this is a critical area of concern.

### **What is the MDCA’s objective?**

*To brief the Community on the key issues and prepare for the upcoming consultation process.*

Community input to the TRMP is a valuable educational process for the TDC. It is a window of opportunity to share our views regarding how to support sustainable development within our village while preserving key elements of what makes Mapua uniquely livable.

Put simply, now is the time to clearly state the community’s priorities in terms of future development, identify “*hot-button issues*” and if required draw key “*lines in the sand*” in terms of what we collectively agree is or is not aligned with our shared vision of Mapua’s future.

### **What can you do?**

Attached is a Map showing Mapua’s existing roads / cycle ways and parking areas, with areas of current and potential future development and associated Indicative Roads.
