Waimeha Inlet Forum Working Group Monday 10th August

- 1. The first Maori inhabitants had given the name Waimeha to the estuary, wai meaning water and meha meaning in and out/coming and going, ie tides. This name will be used in future.
- 2. Update on Waimeha Inlet Restoration Partnership (One Billion Trees project) Progress report on planting and trapping around the estuary.
- 3. The \$500K for implementing the Waimea Inlet Action Plan to be spent on salt marsh restoration and bittern habitat. Saltmarshes sequester more carbon than fresh water wetlands. A bittern expert to be consulted.
- 4. One Billion Trees stage 2 funding has been awarded, planting to continue for three years. Funding includes some jobs.
- 5. TDC Bio strategy individual on-line submissions will be sent in and a draft for the group circulated. Everyone encouraged to send in their own.
- 6. A Blue Carbon public workshop and seminar to be held on 29 August , 10 am to 12 noon at Headingly Centre.
- 7. Application for renewal of consent for Biosolids disposal on Moturoa draft submission will be circulated.
