Elder Abuse Awareness Week



Every year, around the world, we mark Elder Abuse Awareness Week in mid-June. It's a great opportunity to get the public talking about elder abuse, what it involves and what to do about it. The theme this year is 'Elder Abuse Hits Close to Home' as sadly most of the elder abuse is conducted by someone you know. Across New Zealand, 79% of alleged abusers were family members of which 56% were adult children or grandchildren.

At Age Concern Nelson Tasman we provide information support and advocacy around elder abuse. We also provide education to healthcare professionals, carers and agencies around how to spot elder abuse, what to do about it and how to promote dignity and respect of older people. COVID-19 vaccination update: Group 3 roll-out has started

People over 65 are among the country's Group 3 people currently getting the free Pfizer Covid-19 vaccine. They will be contacted over the next few months by a health official, using contact details held by theirnGP or healthcare

provider. If people don't have a GP or don't receive a text notification they can register contact details with Healthline on 0800 282 926.

The large size of Group 3 means that not everyone will be offered the vaccine at the same time, and the DHB is asking people to be patient – everyone in the region will be offered a free vaccine.

Should I get my flu vaccine first or my COVID-19 vaccine?

Get your COVID-19 vaccine first if you already have an appointment booked, otherwise get your flu vaccine first.

The Ministry of Health recommends a two-week gap between getting your flu vaccine and your COVID-19 vaccine.
