

## **MDCA Community Wellbeing Sub-committee report for May 22**

### **Māpua Willing Wheels (MWW)**

In light of the funding challenges noted in the last report, due to low patronage resulting from passenger COVID concerns, the service is applying TDC for funding under their COVID 19 Grant and are hopeful that this will assist in enabling the service to continue alongside the Motueka Wakefield Community Transport schemes

As noted last month, a new administrative structure is being implemented by Nelson Tasman Community Transport Trust to ensure that strong administrative support is provided to the 3 regional community transport services : Māpua, Motueka and Wakefield. As also noted, Rachel Mason will become the Promotion/publicity Co-ordinator and interviewing for the new administration co-ordinator is taking place May 2<sup>nd</sup>

We look forward to the ongoing co-operation between MDCA & NTCTT s to continue supporting the development of a strong and integrated district wide community transport service .
