

Good morning Anne,

and thank you Ali for making contact.

I can confirm that the Smap information are free of charge for individual property and land owners. However, to access the Smap portal on Maps | S-Map Online | Manaaki Whenua - Landcare Research a login will be required. The information on Smap are arranged in different layers with generic soil information and soil factsheets being freely available. More detailed soil information (e.g., such as soil water retention curves) need to be request directly from Landcare Research or be paid for if of commercial interest.

If of interest for private use, some of the Smap data may also be downloaded from the LRIS portal: S-map - a new soil spatial information system for New Zealand (current) - SMAP | | Environment and Land GIS | LRIS Portal (scinfo.org.nz)

And in addition to the above: A worthwhile resource helping to understand what is depicted and used in Smap is the NZ Soils Portal Home: MWLR Soils Portal >> New Zealand Soils Portal - Manaaki Whenua - Landcare Research.

I hope all this makes sense and that access for you, Anne, will become available. If it does not, I would recommend contacting the Smap site host directly.
