

I have a few ideas to start discussion but have not approached anyone yet for costs or feasability:

Could we ask to keep the bins and fundraise as a community to pay for emptying? I for one would be happy to make contributions to that. Sunrise cleaners come regularly to clear rubbish and clean toilets, maybe an option? Collection boxes in a few local shops? Or secure collection boxes next to the most used bins?

Or could we ask a local rubbish contractor to provide a few bins in strategic places and empty them on their weekly runs? Can Plan and Scotts both come regularly.

Ultimately it would be best if TDC come to their senses and provide this basic and necessary service. But if not, I think other options need to be looked into.
