Dear Māpua and Districts Community Association Committee,

I hope you don't mind me reaching out during the current flood situation. I spoke with Wayne Chisnall about a personal matter, and he recommended I get in touch with you.

Also, I contacted the council, but because everything is technically within the regulations, they're not taking any action.

I'm writing to raise a concern about a new shed that is currently being constructed directly between his house and my house in the middle of the village. Although it is said to be for parking and storage, the structure is unnecessarily high — more suited to commercial use — and it completely blocks my morning sunlight, significantly affecting both the value of my home and the overall character of the area.

The loss of sunlight between 8am and 10am each winter morning is having a serious impact on my well-being. It is very disheartening to wake up each day to such a large, out-of-place structure dominating the view.

I would greatly appreciate it if the association could raise this issue or advise me on possible next steps. The work is moving so quickly day by day, and I feel helpless.
